# A Message from the General Manager

"The key to everything is patience. You get the chicken by hatching the egg, not by smashing it." – Arnold H. Glasow

I want to thank you all again for your patience with our Central Avenue water & sewer main rehabilitation project. We should not have to dig up our water and sewer mains along Central for the next 75 years! You can hold me to that! (I of course will be dead long before then, so it might be hard to collect.) I will further guarantee that you will not see a big sinkhole along that portion of Central caused by a waterline failure, like unfortunately happens too frequently these days in other municipalities. Thank you again for your patience as we implemented this important infrastructure project.

We are also starting construction on our 4.5MG Water Storage Tank project this summer. Now I will switch to thanking the folks along Azalea, Cochran and Hewitt for their patience with construction traffic along these roads. When completed, this project will help ensure that your water will not be interrupted during earthquakes or storms or due to the loss of our watermain to Humboldt Bay Municipal Water District. We have received over \$10 million in grants to pay for this \$12M construction job!



We are still waiting to take ownership of the Community Forest land (which is also being purchased entirely with a grant). We expect to take ownership of the land sometime in early 2024. We will be coming to you soon after that to start planning the development of hiking/biking/horse trails and other infrastructure and uses in the forest.

We are also finalizing the design of the BMX Park at School & Washington and will be starting that construction spring of next year. And the first part of the Skate Park in Pierson Park is done! That was a long-term project, that once again proves the quote at the top of the article. Thanks

# Attention McKinleyville Property Owners

Don't forget to mail or drop off your Official Measure B Property Owner Assessment ballots.

Completed ballots must be received by the Board Secretary no later than the close of the Public Hearing scheduled for 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 1, 2023, at Azalea Hall, at 1620 Pickett Road, McKinleyville, CA 95519.

## Important Voting Information

Measure B was originally passed by voters 30 years ago, in 1993, and was reauthorized in 2011 at the same rate. It is a local assessment to help fund McKinleyville services. Measure B funded construction and maintenance of Azalea Hall at Pierson Park, McKinleyville Activity Center at Pierson Park, and Hiller Sports Complex.

On September 6, 2023, The McKinleyville CSD Board unanimously approved a Resolution to renew Measure B and increase the assessment to:

- Maintain the facility housing the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office in McKinleyville;
- Provide services to keep park restrooms open and clean;
- Keep the Senior Center open and maintained;
- Maintain ballfields, playfields, and playgrounds in all parks;
- Maintain facilities such as: the McKinleyville branch of the Humboldt County Library, Azalea Hall, the Teen and Community Center, and the Activity Center.

The proposed assessment would renew Measure B, our locally controlled funding that the State cannot take away, at the \$94 rate per year (less than \$8 a month) with cost-of-living adjustments until ended by voters.

### Q: Who gets a vote?

**A:** The Measure B Assessment is voted on only by McKinleyville property owners. The assessment is calculated based on a District evaluation of community service needs, the revenue needed to address those needs, and an allocation that reflects the benefit provided to each property. If approved by voters, the updated assessment will provide \$700,000 dollars annually, with independent citizens' oversight and annual audits.

### Q: How do I vote?

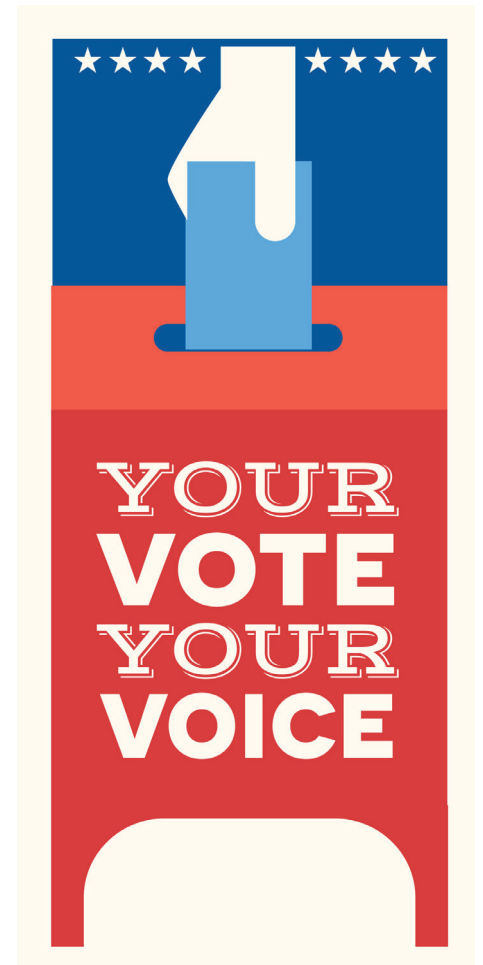
**A:** If you are a property owner in McKinleyville, you should have received your official ballot in the mail. If you didn't receive a ballot, or you think there's been a mistake in the ballot you received, you can call Michael Medve, Assessment Engineer, at (951) 587-3500 or [mmedve@willdan.com](mailto:mmedve@willdan.com) to get a ballot.

### Q: Is my vote a secret?

**A:** Ballots will not be opened or tabulated before the close of the public input portion of the hearing on November 1, 2023. During and after the tabulation, the assessment ballots and the information used to determine the weight of each ballot shall be treated as disclosable public records, as defined in [Gov. Code] Section 6252.

### Q: Will there be a process to apply for an exemption?

**A:** Following the hearing on November 1, 2023, if a majority of property owners have approved the Measure B update, then at the next Board meeting on December 6, 2023, the Board will consider the application process for low-income, disabled, and senior property owners to apply for an exemption.

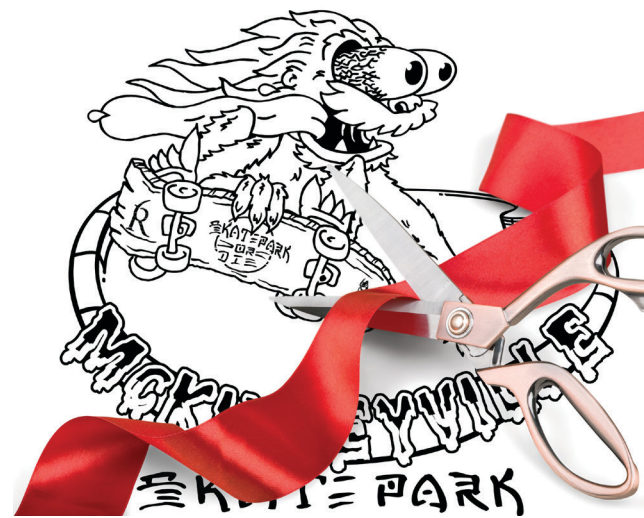

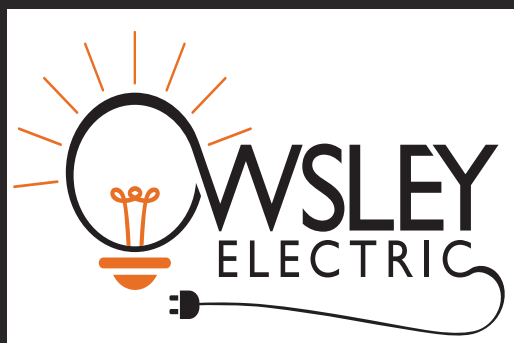

# Don't Touch That Angle Stop!!

So you need to do a little plumbing work on your house, but you quickly figure out that if you don't turn off the water, you'll end up wetter than you intended! You decide to turn off the water at the meter. How hard could it be, right? You go to your water meter and start to turn the angle stop....\*snap\*. You turn it left, then right – but it doesn't seem to be doing anything.

The next step is to call the water district for help, but you are given the following facts:

1. You've broken the angle stop.
2. The angle stop is District property.
3. You are now responsible for the substantial cost of repairing it.

Unfortunately, this story is all-too-familiar to us here at the District. The question is "What can you do instead?" First and foremost, do NOT attempt to operate the angle stop at the meter! This is District property and is only intended to be operated by trained District personnel.

Instead, please consider the following alternatives:

Do you have a well on the property? If so, the well is required to have a double-check valve. This valve has a component that allows you to turn off the water to everything past the check valve.

If the plumbing problem is inside the house, look for a shut-off valve at the base of your house. This is usually located below a hose-bib where your water line first meets your house.

If neither of those cases apply, call the District office during business hours (9:00 am – 5:00 pm Monday through Friday). The District staff will come out and turn the water off for you. The cost of this service (turning the water off and turning it back on when you are ready) is \$40 during business hours. After hours or on a weekend, the call-out charge is \$150. However, both charges are MUCH cheaper than the cost to repair a broken angle stop!

Looking to avoid the call-out charge in the future? We recommend that, while you are in plumbing repair mode with the water turned off, you also install a shut-off valve just past the meter on the customer (your) side. This will allow you to turn the water off yourself at any time without risking damage to the District's equipment.



We understand that any planned (or unforeseen!) circumstances that involve working on your home's water system can prove stressful. We here at McKinleyville Community Services District desire that work go as smoothly for you as possible so please heed our warning. Give us a call if you need us...and don't touch that angle stop!

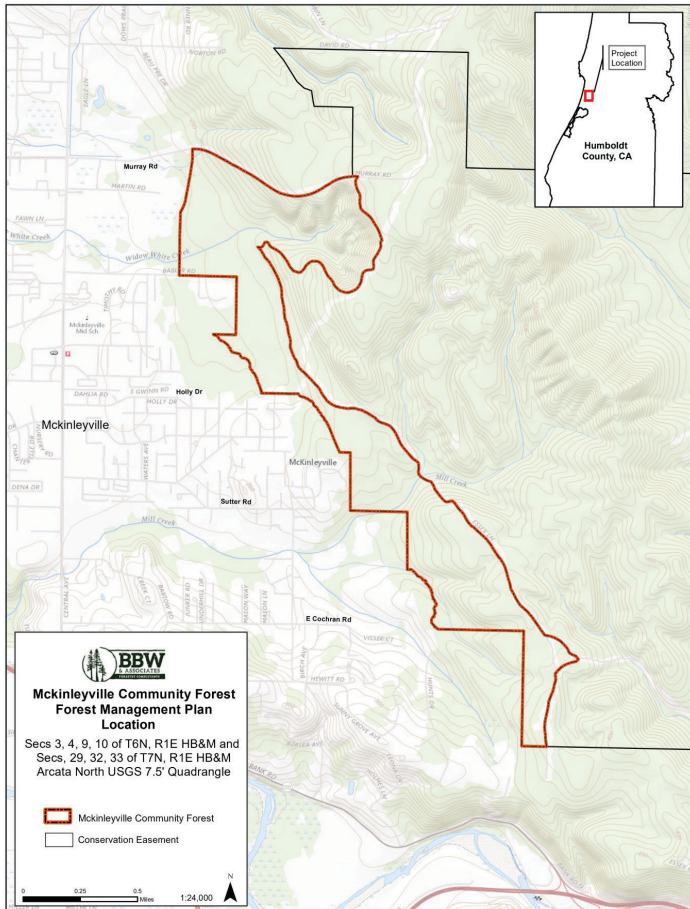
## **PARC Vacancies**

Park And Recreation Committee members serve the McKinleyville Community Services District, through providing insight, input and recommendations to the MCSD Board of Directors on policies, programs and projects relating to McKinleyville's parks, facilities, open spaces and recreation activities.

Current projects that the PARC members are discussing include the BMX track development, the acquisition and subsequent management of a community forest in McKinleyville, improvements to the Community Garden at Pierson Park, the expansion and renovation of Pierson Park to include the Skate Park Phase 2.. If you have expertise or interest in the areas of recreation, parks, open space and natural resource management, marketing and/or any of the specific projects currently under discussion, please consider joining the PARC.

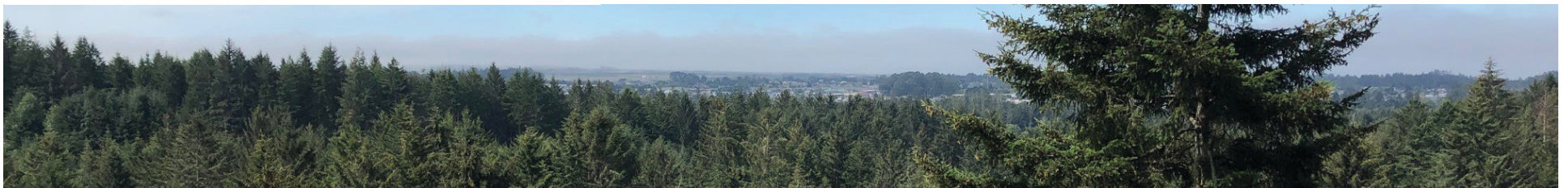
# McKinleyville Community Forest Update



Staff continues to meet monthly with Green Diamond Resource Company. The Community Forest Committee met on September 21st. Green Diamond has completed the legal descriptions needed to update the preliminary title report and the certification of the appraisal. A Phase 1 Environmental Site Assessment has been completed and reviewed by staff.

Green Diamond Resource Company is coordinating clean-up events to clear out garbage and debris that has been dumped and left behind within the community forest property. They hope to have the clean up completed by mid-October.

McKinleyville Community Services District expects to take ownership of the land sometime in early 2024. Next Steps include soliciting Public input on planning the development of hiking/biking/horse trails and other infrastructure and uses in the forest.



## BMX Park Update

Excitement is building for the BMX Park Development on School Road & Washington Avenue. Melton Design Group submitted the 75% construction design documents on September 15th. Staff is currently reviewing them. 100% construction documents are anticipated by December. We anticipate construction to begin in the spring of 2024, completed by the end of 2024.

In addition to the BMW track, this park will have a pickleball court, half-court basketball court, playground equipment, restrooms and a concessions stand, walking paths and green spaces and landscaping.
