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Teen & Community Center Update

The Teen and Community Center project went out to bid in the spring of 2015. The lowest bid, submitted by Adams Commercial General Contracting Incorporated (ACGC Inc.), was approved by McKinleyville Community Services District's Board of Directors at the July 1, 2015 Board Meeting. The construction time line is 270 days until completion. ACGC Inc. began construction on July 13, 2015; therefore it should be completed as early as April 2016.

McKinleyville Community Services District (MCSD) and the Boys & Girls Club of the Redwoods (BGCR) are in the process of producing a Memorandum of Understanding and a Business Plan for staffing and programming specific to teen use of the facility. The intended result of this work is opening a Boys & Girls Club of the Redwoods Teen Center in McKinleyville. The construction and the maintenance of the Teen and Community Center are funded through local ballot Measure B; however, this funding does not include furnishing of the building. MCSD, in partnership with BGCR, has launched a fundraising campaign to gain the funds necessary to furnish the entire building.



Using grant funds from the S.H. Cowell Foundation, MCSD and BGCR have been working toward building the youth leadership in McKinleyville and developing a sound business partnership for the management and use of the Teen and Community Center. In April of 2014, with the consultation of the Youth Leadership Institute in the Bay Area, MCSD and BGCR hosted a four day Youth Leadership Summit involving twelve local youth. The outcome of this process was the creation of the McKinleyville Youth Leadership Society (MYLS). With guidance from MCSD and BGCR staff, the MYLS is currently working on recruiting members, creating a book exchange, and volunteering in the community at various events (*see page 13 to learn more about MYLS*).

The new Teen and Community Center was developed using an integrated collaborative approach with input gathered from teens and the community at large. The architecture and planning firm LDA Partners was hired to assist in the collaboration process, which included: teen brainstorming sessions; meetings with community service organizations; meetings with the general public; presentations at the local junior high school; polling the youth offline and online via social media; and presenting the design to the McKinleyville Municipal Advisory Committee.



As a result of these collaborative efforts, McKinleyville teens and the community at large will have the facility they helped design. Soon they will be able to enjoy a 6,600 square-foot center that will include a quiet study room, a divisible multi-purpose room, a sound-proof music room, a central game room that can be used for multiple activities, a covered outdoor performance area, and a community commercial kitchen to augment an existing area that will seat 450 for banquets and where cooking classes can be held. The center has been designed so that up to seven distinct and separate activities could take place at the same time without programmatic overlap.

Since funding for the project construction will be levied on property tax bills for the community members of McKinleyville over a 20 year period (Measure B), a means for financing the construction of the building would be necessary for the success and completion of the community's vision. The California Special District Association Finance Corporation, in partnership with consultant firm Brandis Tallman, was able to facilitate the financing for the amount of 1.4 million.

Boys & Girls Club of the Redwoods

The Boys & Girls Clubs of the Redwoods is a youth development program for youth ages 6 to 18. All of our sites offer a safe place for these children to learn, play and develop citizenship and leadership skills. Club programs and services promote and enhance the development of our members by instilling a sense of competence, usefulness, belonging and a power of influence, which is the Youth Development Strategy of the Boys & Girls Clubs.

The Club focuses on five core areas of development: Sports, Fitness and Social Recreation, Character and Leadership Development, Health and Life Skills, The Arts, and Education and Career. Focusing on these areas provides the children who participate the opportunity to engage in programs that will enable them to develop positive self images and reach their full potential.



Every day members are helped with their homework, participate in organized sports, arts and crafts projects, and enjoy a nutritious snack. In addition to regular Club activities, members often attend field trips, have interesting and relevant guest speakers, and have a regular schedule of prevention workshops and teen support groups.

Mission:

We empower youth to reach their full potential as responsible, caring and productive citizens through professionally led programs and activities that are fun, positive and relevant in a safe, supportive and healthy environment.

Youth Development Strategy:

This strategy defines how our youth development professionals and volunteers interact with young people. All programs and activities are designed to maximize opportunities for young people to acquire four basic “senses” which help them build self-esteem and grow into responsible and caring citizens. These four “senses” are:

- A SENSE OF COMPETENCE - the feeling there is something boys and girls can do well.
- A SENSE OF USEFULNESS - the opportunity to do something of value for other people.
- A SENSE OF BELONGING - a setting where young people know they “fit” and are accepted.
- A SENSE OF POWER OR INFLUENCE - a chance to be heard and to influence decisions.

The principles of the Youth Development Strategy are used when developing every program and activity. We seek to identify and incorporate ways to enhance programs and activities through the conscious utilization of these youth development principles.

When this strategy is fully implemented, self-esteem is enhanced and the environment is created which helps boys and girls achieve their full potential.

Our Vision:
We envision healthy, empowered and engaged youth who appreciate and respect themselves, each other, their families, the community and the environment.

Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade

The District completed a 20 Year Wastewater Facilities Plan in January 2012. The Plan identifies a series of upgrades to the District's existing wastewater treatment plant including portions of the effluent disposal system. The improvements will address the needs for the facility through the year 2030. The Plan presents several treatment alternatives and recommends replacing the existing facultative lagoon system with an in-basin extended aeration system. Subsequently, two manufacturers of in-basin extended aeration systems, Bioworks and Parkson, have been chosen as the preferred vendors for the extended aeration system.

The Wastewater Management Facility improvements include a new headworks facility; aeration basins; a blower/electrical/maintenance building; two new secondary clarifiers, including return activated sludge/waste activated sludge (RAS/WAS) pumping; and a biosolids storage basin. The preliminary design cost estimate indicates the bid price to be approximately \$13.2M.

The first phase of the upgrade progress, a Biosolids Project, was completed in January of this year. Pond 1A was taken out of service, drained, and dredged by SynaGro WWT Inc. The sludge was then dewatered and the resulting biosolids hauled off. This pond will be filled for construction of the improvement project. District staff have been dewatering the pond while still meeting permit requirements on the existing treatment facility. Pond 1A is now 99% dewatered.

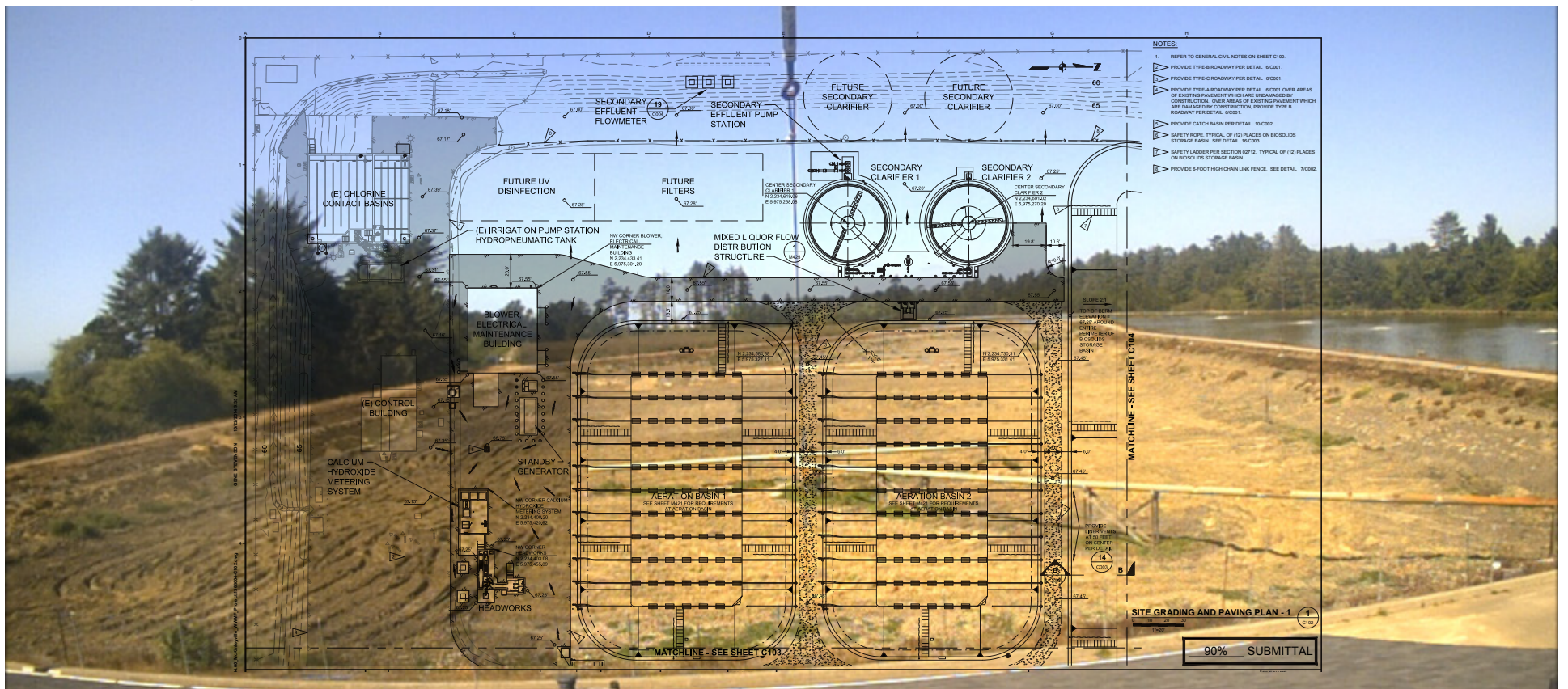
A time-lapse camera was installed at the plant. It will take snapshots daily to chronicle the progress of construction. Following completion of the new upgrade, a video will be made from the snapshots.

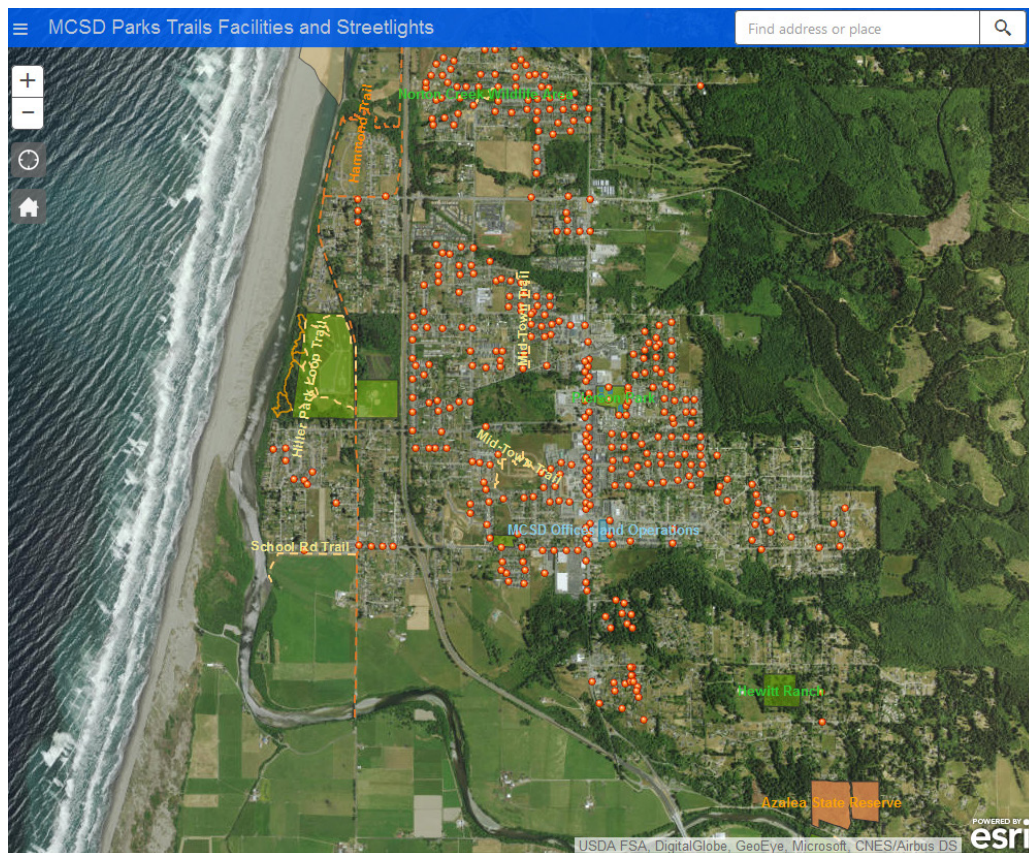
Kennedy/Jenks has been tasked with preparing a Report of Waste Discharge. Before a new NPDES (National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System) permit can be issued for the new plant, the Report of Waste Discharge must be completed. The Report compiles all pertinent discharge information into a single document including descriptions of the service area, collection system, treatment facilities and effluent disposal and reclaimed water facilities.

The "bid set" of plans are now available for pickup at your local Builders Exchange or at the MCSD office. Sealed bids will be received at the District office at 1656 Sutter Road in McKinleyville on Thursday, October 22, 2015, 2:00 p.m. local time. Bids received after that time will not be accepted. Bids received via email are not acceptable. Bids will be opened in public and read aloud shortly after the specified closing time. Interested parties are invited to attend.

Waste treatment is dull until it does not work. The District is upgrading our system to meet state standards. It's a good thing.

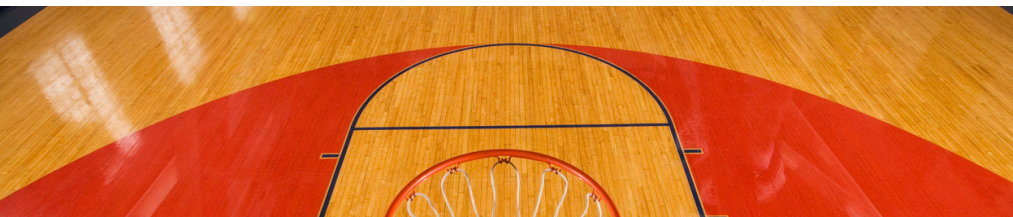

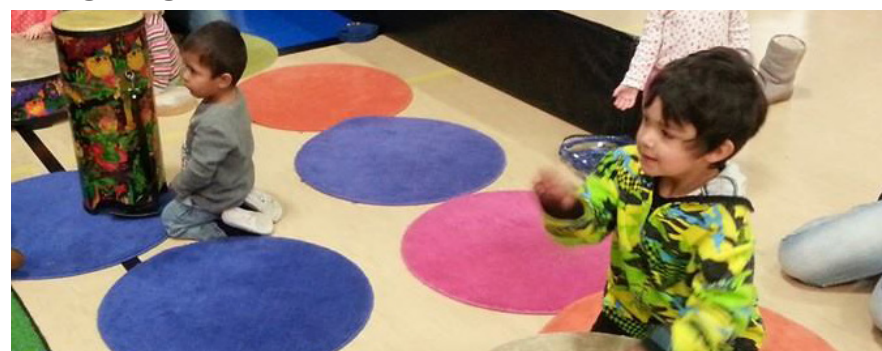

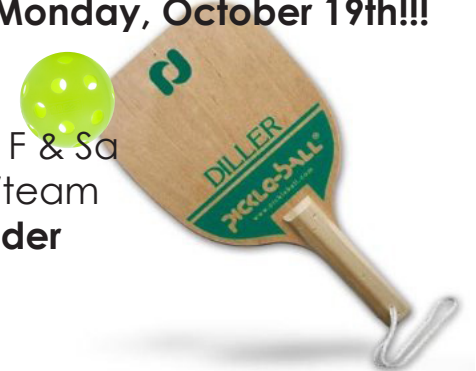
